SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

June 2023 Supervisor's Report Supervisor's Report

- 1. I reviewed the credit card monthly charges and found no issues.
- 2. There was a Court Clerk's meeting on Monday, May 22, 9 am, in the Court Room for NARCAM Training by the NYS DOH. It was well attended. The training was very informative. Thanks to our court clerks for putting this training together.
- 3. In addition to resident Nancy Percik discussing her concerns regarding the renovations of the BAGSAI complex, I also spoke to a resident who also lives near the complex and I decided to reach out to County Executive Garnor to discuss their plans and in particular, the lighting. The county is reviewing a possible plan for holding a public information meeting on this project in the near future.
- 4. It was announced at my recent New York Association of Towns Board of Directors meeting in Albany that Gerry Geist, Executive Director, will be retiring in May of next year. We will consider whether or not to hire him as a part-time consultant. We appointed a search committee for Gerry's replacement.

- 5. Peter Baynes, Executive Director for NYS Conference of Mayors is also leaving his post to become an executive with NYMIR.
- 6. The homeless person who has been residing in the bus shelter at Front and Old Front St. left for a few days only to return. He has been there for a very long time and takes up the entire shelter so bus passengers waiting for the bus have to stand outside of the shelter. We have voiced our concerns with county transportation and the sheriff.
- 7. Our Equalization Rate is at 58.5. This low rate is mostly due to homes that continue to sell at rates higher than what they are assessed for. Every municipality is experiencing the same thing. There is no need at this time to take any action.
- 8. We received our quarterly franchise payment from Spectrum for the amount of \$7,822.55.
