SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

January 2024 Town Board Meeting Supervisor's Report

- 1. I reviewed the credit card monthly charges and found no issues.

A Variance Request was submitted to build an 8 x 20 ft. front porch without the required property line setback. The homeowner did not show up for the meeting. The request was denied.

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: Councilman Morabito questioned if there was a way that we would be allowed to get into properties to look at water being disposed into our sewer systems. We are getting so much infiltration to our water system and it's burning out our pumps. It could cause a lot of problems in the future. If one of those pumps goes it could back up all kinds of homes and sewage. Attorney Coughlin explained that we could require flow meters which would be a huge undertaking to have them installed and they also can be problematic. If we have good evidence of a household doing that, the town could get an administrative search warrant and go in and inspect it. Another suggestion was to send out a letter to make residents aware of the problem as most people are probably unaware of what is happening. If the town has to replace a pump it will cost the town \$50,000.
