SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

Supervisor's Report February 2022

For those persons attending our meetings in-person, we ask that everyone continue to wear a mask when entering our Town Hal at this time. We will continue to practice safe distance seating in our board room for those attending our town board, zoning board and planning board meetings. In the event of the County and or our Town calling a State of Emergency due to increases in **COVID-19** cases in the County, we will take appropriate action to keep our staff and residents as safe as possible including the cancelation of in person meetings. At the present time, **COVID** cases have decreased significantly, and our local hospitals capacity has increased.

Supervisor's Report

- 1. Just a reminder: Residents who fail to pay their water/sewer bills will be sent water turn off warning, and if bills are not paid, we will turn off their water until the bill is paid. This will start in January and will be strictly enforced.
- 2. I reviewed the town credit card charges and found no issues
- 3. The Town Planning Board held their January 24th meeting via ZOOM. Jerry Ford was reelected as Chairman and Hans Van Houton was re-elected to serve as Co-Chair.
- 4. Chairman Ford would like to have Planning Board By-laws/Protocols put in place to assist them in determining various timelines and guidelines related to various projects that come

before them. There was also a discussion on the status of the **Fairview** proposal, site plans, status, etc. Steve Rafferty has been able to get Fairview to submit revised plans including lighting specs that will assist in finalizing this project. Chairman Ford will be submitting an article for the Town Newsletter regarding the Solar project that was recently finalized by the planning board.

- 5. We are still seeing police being called to the **EconoLodge.** I believe that the last call was for a medical issue and not necessarily a hotel occupant.
- 6. I noticed that several staff and town officials attended the mandated NYMIR Sexual Harassment class held about 2 weeks ago. Those of you who have not taken the class, please go to the NYMIR website to review future classes.
- 7. The Annual Code & Enforcement Report was sent out by Steve Rafferty and accepted by the Uniform Code & Energy Administration of New York.
- 8. We received a check from the Broome County Sheriff's office for \$16,128.06 for the fourth quarter of 2021 for Inmate House agreement.
- 9. I will be asking the board to go into Executive Session to discuss a personnel issue.

Attorney VanWhy stated that the next step is to have Supervisor Marinaccio sign the contract and the other party sign and continue as a real estate transaction.

SMOKE FREE GROUNDS POLICY

Clerk Cerretani provided the Board members with a **Smoke Free Grounds** information packet. Supervisor Marinaccio asked the board members to review the information to discuss changes to our current policy at the next work session. Mr. VanWhy asked Clerk Cerretani to locate the Town's current policy and distribute to the members. Attorney VanWhy suggested that we keep the policy broad. He stated that 'No Smoking' covers cannabis, tobacco, and any other

substance to come along in the future. If the board members have any input, it can be discussed at the next work session. Supervisor Marinaccio would like to have a discussion regarding prohibiting smoking on town hall grounds as well as other town properties. Attorney VanWhy said that it makes a lot of sense, but it would be an enforcement issue. Most of the smoking occurs on days when court is in session, and we might be able to get assistance from the police officer on duty to enforce the policy.

Mr. VanWhy stated there is already a general prohibition on smoking within a certain number of feet of a government facility's door so it might be as simple as putting out signs reminding people of that and asking them to respect the request.

PUBLIC WORKS

- Highway Superintendent Kie reported that Water Department Superintendent Matt Fitzpatrick responded to another water break on Ferndale Drive between Iris and Rosedale Drive. It was repaired quickly and did not impact water service.
- Mr. Kie asked the Board's approval for the purchase of a **Neptune hand-held meter reader** for reading the water meters. It is an update to what we currently have. The cost is \$9,233.50. Software is not included. The item has been budgeted for. On a motion by Councilperson Burns and seconded by Councilperson Exley. All in favor.
- Mr. Kie asked for Board approval to purchase a **Dual Correlator System** to help the water department locate breaks. The item is in the budget. The cost of the system is \$24,685.00. Mr. Kie stated that when we outsource to find a water break the cost is \$2,000/hr. We have already had seven water breaks this year, so it makes economic sense and is cost effective to have our own system. Attorney VanWhy asked what process is being used to procure the item. Public Works Commissioner Kie stated that there is only one manufacturer for the product. Mr. VanWhy then stated that because it is a specialty piece of equipment it may be purchased as a sole source procurement. He then asked Mr. Kie to supply backup documentation to the Town Clerk for filing. On a motion of Councilperson Gardner and seconded by Councilperson Burns approving the purchase of a **Dual Correlator System** at a cost of \$24,685.00. All in favor.
- Public Works Commissioner Kie asked for Board approval to upgrade the **PRV** (**Pressure Reducing Valve**) **Station** at Sunset and Glenwood Roads at a cost of \$80,000. Mr. Kie stated that it has been temporarily repaired. Supervisor Marinaccio commented that the American Rescue Funds are available for this project and two or three other projects. We are looking at putting a roof protector and gutters on the Town Hall at a cost of twenty to twenty-five thousand dollars come spring. On a motion of Councilperson Morabito and seconded by Councilperson Burns to approve the upgrade to the **Pressure Reducing Valve Station** at a cost of \$80,000. All in favor.

ZONING

Zoning Board Chair Compton will get with the Zoning Board members to schedule a hearing the beginning of March regarding 48 Downs Ave.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Resident Jim Love asked Mr. Kie if he considered cost sharing with other municipalities. He responded that they have and the other municipalities either do not want to or they do not have the money.

The meeting was adjourned into Executive Session on motion of Councilperson Gardner and seconded by Councilperson Exley at 6:47 PM to discuss a personnel matter.

The Executive Session adjourned at 7:02 PM and returned into regular session.
